

Many also make an Act of Spiritual Communion when they can and do attend Mass but something prevents them from receiving sacramental Communion that day, such as a mortal sin that they have not had the opportunity to confess yet.

Our Priests, Our Responsibility

According to the 2021 Australian Census, there were 5,075,907 Catholics across the country—representing 19.9% of the total population. In the same year, there were 2,900 priests serving in Australia, including both diocesan and religious order priests. That's roughly 1,751 Catholics for every priest. This number highlights the growing strain on our clergy. In 1971, there were 3,895 priests in Australia. Since then, the number has declined by around 25%, even as the pastoral needs have grown. From 2012 to 2022, 727 overseas-born clergy arrived to support our local Church, thanks to partnerships with international dioceses and religious communities. These missionary priests have been a tremendous blessing, but the need remains great. Let us be mindful of this reality—not to lose hope, but to be moved to support, encourage, and pray for our priests. And most importantly, to pray for more vocations, that God may raise up new shepherds for His flock in our land.

Let's work together to care for those who care for us.

In Australia, there is one priest for every 1751 parishioners. One man... To carry the weight of thousands of souls. To hear confessions.

To visit the sick. To bury the dead.

To preach, to counsel, to baptise, to anoint...

To bring Christ into the lives of thousands, every single day.

How long can he bear this burden alone? How does one shepherd tend to 1751 sheep?

And when we see the cracks in the Church... When we feel the absence, the struggle, the silence—

Do we blame the priests?

Or should we first look at ourselves?

Where are the reinforcements?

Where are the men who could have answered the call, but didn't?

Where are the lay people who were called to support, to pray, to act – but chose to stand back and critique instead?

The priesthood isn't just a calling. It's a battlefield. And far too many of our priests are fighting alone.

If you're a single man reading this, ask yourself: Am I being called? And if not—am I at least doing everything I can to support those who are?

The Church doesn't just need more prayers. It needs more holy priests. And it needs more lay people willing to rise up and take responsibility.

The question isn't just, "Where are our priests?" The deeper question is: Where are we?
